Summary of the Board of Directors' Meeting on December 10, 2015

The Board:

- Discussed the draft Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) Feasibility Study
 with the consultant (Don Schlenger) and requested supplemental information
 for further discussion at the Board's January 14, 2016 meeting. AMI transmits
 meter readings by radio and has the potential to reduce operating costs compared to
 current metering technology, and to help customers and staff become aware more
 quickly about unexpected increases in water use, apparent leaks, etc.
- Received and discussed a cost of service analysis summary completed to inform future water and sewer rate structure decisions. The cost allocation study was completed by Burton and Associates, OWASA's rate consultant. The Board requested additional information and a wider range of options for review at the January 28, 2016 meeting.
- Discussed the Executive Director's proposed 2015-2016 performance goals and schedule for performance evaluations.
